- 4. Completion of GE and specified departmental requirements.
- 5. Completion of 16 credit hours of coursework from one language to include 1010, 1020, 2010, and 202G/2020 levels or transferred equivalents.
- 6. Successful completion of at least one Global/Intercultural course.
